¹⁰ I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. ¹¹ I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. ¹³ I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

- 1. View everything is from God
- 2. Pray "Father, What is your goal in my adversity?"
- 3. Surrender to the unknown will of God
- 4. Rest in God's Trustworthiness that God will see you through.
