## What is the Ten Commandments?

## Matthew 5:17 NIV

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.

## Exodus 20:3-17

Are the 10 Commandments old? Did Jesus come to throw them away so that they no long apply to us? NO! Jesus had said that He was not here to abolish the law but to fulfill it. Jesus had said in

Matthew 5:17 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.

So what then can we say that the 10 Commandments are? I believe the answer lies in studying who Jesus is. 1 Corinthians 13, is known as the description or definition of love to many. I have learned a truth in my study of God's word. Quite simply that Jesus is Love! Now if we read 1 Corinthians 13, substituting Jesus's Name for the word love. It rings with truth. It helps us to understand that truly Jesus is Love!

So what are the the Ten Commandments? When Jesus was asked about the greatest Commandment, his answer was based on Love.

Mark 12:28-31 <sup>28</sup> One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"

Jesus with this statement gave us the perfect definition of the Ten Commandments, Love!

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>29</sup> "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. <sup>[a] 30</sup> Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' <sup>[b] 31</sup> The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

Paul confirms this in his summation of the Ten Commandments...

Galations 5:14 "The entire law is summed up in a single command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

Quite simply the 10 Commandments are Love. Jesus is Love. Jesus is the Ten Commandments. This is perfectly illustrated by John 1:1-5

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome[a] it.
